How to Talk to Children about the Events in Ukraine.

As hostilities in Ukraine escalate, children may see and hear things about the crisis in the news or online. This may lead to feelings of uncertainty, anxiety and fear which parents and caregivers are strongly advised to address.

In school, we will address this as is deemed appropriate to the age of the class and in response to their fears or questions. However, we do strongly advise families to come together to talk about this too.

To support our families with this conversation, I attach a range of information that will be useful for you to read before approaching the subject with children.

As ever, we encourage parents and carers to be mindful of what information pupils do have access to online. Regular monitoring of pupils' use of the internet is essential to ensure that any information they see or hear is appropriate for their age, their emotional intelligence and is not misinformation or propaganda.
